In a lawsuit (Case # 02-14044) filed this morning at the Federal Courthouse in <u>West Palm Beach, Florida</u>, management at Southern Eagle, including Peter Busch, were named by a former employee who claims she was sexually harassed and even sexually assaulted by management over a five-year period.

Today, Friday, February 8, 2002 at 2:30 p.m., attorney Guy Rubin will hold a news conference regarding the details of the suit at his law offices located at 520 South Federal Highway, Stuart, Florida.

The former employee, who was Peter Busch's administrative assistant, will be present to speak to the media about the numerous sexual allegations.

Attorney Guy Rubin is also handling pending cases against corporate giant Tyco and Martin Memorial Health Systems, as well as wrongful death federal cases in the Frank Valdes murder in the <u>Florida State</u> Prison and the death of 12-year-old Michael Wiltsie in one of Florida's boot camp programs.
